## <u>Curriculum</u>

#### <u>Homework</u>

Year 6 homework is slightly different to previous years as it will focus on specific English and Maths tasks in readiness for the SATS assessments. I will give the children one piece of homework to complete each week on a Thursday. This is to be returned by the

following **Wednesday**. Please also look out for weekly spelling lists, which will be provided by your child's spelling teacher. These will be handed out on Friday and tested the following Friday. Additionally, reading records will be checked every Monday. The children are expected to read for at least 20 minutes, three times a week and to record this in the diary (with details of the text title, pages read and a comment).

## <u>P.E.</u>

This term, the children will have P.E. on Wednesday. However, it is essential for the children have their kit in school every day. All children should have indoor and outdoor kit, such as shorts, t-shirt and trainers for indoor use, and tracksuit bottoms, a long-sleeved top and trainers for outdoor sessions. **Please ensure that your child's PE kit is clearly named.** 





During Term 1, the children will be attending Forest School on **Tuesdays** where they will need a change of clothing for outdoor activities. See separate letter for more details. During Term 2, children will have swimming lessons on **Mondays**. You will also receive a separate letter regarding this.

All children will also the opportunity to participate in have cycling proficiency sessions. Please ensure that the children bring their bikes to school each Wednesday along with a helmet.
