Reading Books

Children are well in the habit of bringing their reading diary and reading book home and we will also continue to read with them at least once a week in school, whether in guided reading groups or on an individual basis. When you read with them at home, please encourage them to predict what may come next, to summarise what has happened, to discuss new vocabulary, talk about the characters and explain their



preferences for books. It continues to be very important that the children are reading at home as well as school to build their confidence in a range of texts and to practise their tricky words as well as decodable words. Please do record their reading sessions in their reading diary. Children need to bring their reading books and diaries into school every day.



P.E.

P.E. will take place on a Monday and Friday, but it is essential that children have named kit in school every day. Please make sure that children have suitable clothing for outdoor P.E. (jumper, sports trousers, spare socks and trainers). We are learning our May Day dances and about attacking and defending. Where possible, our P.E. lessons will take place outside.

Homework

The children should hand in any work that they have done at home on a **Wednesday**, to allow time for marking, before being given back on a **Friday**. Please help your child to complete homework tasks if they need it, but as far as possible let the work be their own. Spelling quiz words will be given out on a Thursday in preparation for the following week.
