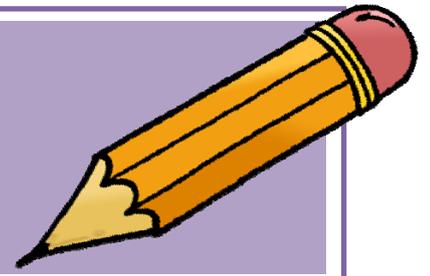

Each week, you need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure that you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.





English Activities:

- Have a go at making a poster to tell people how to write a good sentence, reminding them about capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
- Research the season of autumn. Can you write a list of adjectives to describe autumn? As a challenge, can you write these words into a sentence?
- Design and write your own postcard from the city of Rome. Tell us about the wonderful sights in Rome such as the Colosseum, fountains and the food, such as, pasta and pizza.
- How many words can you think of that describe your favourite character in a book?

Maths Activities:

- As we are practising counting in 2s, can you think of a fun way to show the 2 times table? You might want to think about things that come in 2s.
- Can you draw pictures of how you split a number into 10s and 1s? For example, how can you split the number 19? How many tens and how many ones?
- Choose a number, can you work out 1 more and 1 less, as well as 10 more and 10 less.
- Roll a dice to gather your numbers. Have a look at adding and subtracting them. Are you able to subtract? Does it matter which way round the numbers go for adding?



Topic Activities:

- Find out some interesting information about Roman clothes. What did they wear? Can you design an outfit that they might have worn during these times?
- Safety is really important. Think of something you need to do to keep safe; it may be crossing the road, being safe around strangers, or keeping safe online. Share your knowledge with others by creating a video, poster or leaflet.
- Have a go writing your own recipe for a new pizza. Remember to take photos of your finished product.
- The Romans were famous for using mosaics in their villas. Carry out some research and then design and make your own. You could use paper, paint, and chalk or felt tip pens.



Personalised homework: Personalised homework is all about what you want to show us. Think about our topic (An Italian Adventure) and the events that are coming up. Then create something to bring in and show, such as a model or piece of creative art. Next term, we would like to show your creations in our museum. Think about famous inventions such as: roads, aqueducts and Roman villas. You can use any materials that you have at home. Have fun! 😊
