Each week you need to choose ~~one~~ of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure you choose a range of activities (some from ing the term.

English Activities:

- Create a story board based on the Romulus and Remus story about the founding of Rome in 753BC. Use this link to help you https://www.ducksters.com/history/ancient_rome/romulus_and_remus.php Think about the events that happened and the order that they happened. You could print the pictures off the computer or draw them yourself. Remember to write at least one sentence to explain what was going on each picture.
- Have a go at creating a fact file all about the Romans. You could include drawings or photos.
- Have a go at writing your own a diary entry as someone in a British village that has been taken over by the Romans. Think about using adjectives to describe what you could see, hear, smell and don't forget to describe your feeling.
- This term, one of our focuses will be on poetry. Can you write your own poem inspired by our Italian adventure topic? It could be an acrostic poem, a rhyming poem or a descriptive poem.

Maths Activities:

- We are consolidating our knowledge of Place value of 3-digit numbers, (HTU) and comparing numbers. You could use this website to play place value games. <http://pbskids.org/cyberchase/media/games/numbersense/>
- This term we will be looking at common 2D and 3D shapes. You could make 3D shapes out of a net and decorate it. Remember to discuss it features; number of faces, edges and vertices. <http://www.senteacher.org/worksheet/12/NetsPolyhedra.html>.
- We will be learning all about units of measure. Measuring: Practise measuring capacity and weight when baking, or measure the length of a piece of furniture using a tape measure. Compare a number of objects and put them in order from longest to shortest.

Topic Activities:

- Have a go at writing 10 interesting facts about the Romans. Or find out about one of the important figures;
- The Romans were famous for using mosaics in their villas. Carry out some research and then design ad make your own. You could use paper, paint, chalk or felt tip pens.
- Have a go at informing people about how to keep safe, you could think about how to keep safe in a swimming pool, crossing a road or even on the computer. Think about how you will share the information you could; creating a video, poster or leaflet.
- Have a go writing your own recipe for a new pizza and then cooking your creation. Remember to take photos of your finished product.

Personalised homework: Personalised homework is all about what you want to show us. Think about our topic (An Italian adventure) and the events that are coming up. Then create something to bring in and show such as a model or piece of creative art. Next term we would like to show your creations in our museum. Think about famous inventions such roads, aqueducts and Roman villas. You can use any materials. Have fun! 😊
