

Each week, you need to choose one of these activities to complete in your homework book and hand in on Wednesday. Make sure you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.


English Activities:

- Have a go at writing the Christmas story from a different perspective. Think about how the donkey may have felt, or the inn keeper. Read Jesus' Christmas party by Nicholas Allan for some ideas.
- Read or listen to a story. Try to write down what you enjoyed most about the story and why. It could be the descriptions of the characters, the setting or what happened to make you laugh.
- Create your own Christmas decoration, then write the instructions so that they can be followed by someone else. Remember to include imperative verbs, adverbs, pictures or diagrams and a list of what you need.
- We will be covering poetry this term. Read some poems. Could you learn a poem to perform in front of the class? Then have a go at writing your own! It could include rhyme, alliteration or it could be an acrostic poem! You could be inspired by something you have learnt about in our topic work or maybe Christmas!



Maths Activities:

- Money: Practise finding change using the following game online:

- Roll a dice to get two numbers. Instead of adding, try multiplying (x) them instead. Can you draw a picture to help you work it out?
- Can you think of a fun and unique way to teach other children the 3, 4 and 8 times tables? You could create a poster, make a video or even create a rap.
- As we are learning all about Italy and the Roman, why not find out about Roman Numerals. Could you make a poster to explain to the class about how Roman numerals work? We could even put your posters on display.



Topic Activities:

- Create a themed collage using magazine cut outs or pictures from the computer. You could use make something to do with Italy such as the Italian flag or a famous Italian landmark, such as the leaning Tower of Pisa.
- Research the country of South Africa or Italy. You could find out about the animals, landmarks, weather or even the people. Think of an interesting way to present your information, which could be a leaflet, a poster, a PowerPoint or even a video.
- This term, we will be focussing on local history. Can you find out if there is any interesting information about how the Romans effected the local area? You could visit the Woodstock museum or the Roman Villa in East End. <https://www.english-heritage.org.uk/visit/places/north-leigh-roman-villa/>
