




Each week you need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.



Maths Activities:

- Numbers - keep practising your number skills. Compare two numbers - which is larger and which is smaller? Have another go at addition and subtraction with numbers up to 20.
- Capacity - gather some different sized containers and explore which one holds the most and which holds the least. Does the tallest container always hold the most water?
- Height - gather a selection of objects and order them from tallest to shortest. You could even do this with members of your family! You could also measure how tall each object or person is.
- Shapes and patterns - how many 2D shapes do you know? Go on a shape walk and try to find as many different shapes as you can. You could use a selection of 2D shapes to make a picture or a repeating pattern.



Topic Activities:

- Lots of traditional tales are set in the woods or a forest. Get outdoors and explore your local woodland. Take photos of some of the things you see, or draw a map of your journey through the woods.
- In R.E. we will be thinking about the question "What do people believe about the beginning of the world?" You could look at the Creation story in the Bible, or have a conversation with your family to hear their thoughts.
- Make a model of your favourite fairy tale setting. For example, you could build a Lego beanstalk, or use a shoebox to make The Three Bear's house.
- We will be growing magic beans in class, but you could plant some different beans or seeds and keep a diary of what happens to them as they grow. You could use your Maths skills to measure how tall your plant gets.
