
Please join me in wishing Sophie B a very happy birthday! She made her own cake, which I am sure you will agree, looks delicious!




Georgina has been helping to look after these very cute lambs on her farm! Some of the children at school suggested names for them; Georgina chose Cupcake and Tinkerbell.
