


## English Activities:

## Maths Activities:

- Use an analogue clock (with hands) to recognise o'clock, half past, quarter to, and quarter past the hour. Perhaps you could make a clock with a paper plate and movable hands
- Draw what you do at different times of the day with a clock showing the time of each activity.
- Practise using the language of position and direction - for example - 'Make a quarter turn clockwise, move forwards three steps and turn a half turn anti-clockwise.'
- Draw ways to represent numbers to 50 these could be bundles of straws, counters,
  coins or objects from the food cupboard.
   Practise counting from different starting
  points below 50 forwards and back.



## Topic Activities:

- Research what kinds of toys your parents and grandparents played with when they were children - perhaps you could interview them and ask them to show you some pictures online or in their photo albums.
- Can you label a picture of your favourite toy - what is it made of?
   Where was it made? Can you make a Lego model or junk model of the toy?
- Find out more about Palm Sunday can you draw a story board to show Jesus travelling into Jerusalem on a donkey?
- Explain what you know about the four seasons of the year.
